


Here's how it works

The activity is aimed at improving people's navigational skills through practical map reading to ground skills, how to use a compass and have a bit of fun! No GPS or smart phones are allowed to be used as a navigational aid on course.

The activity area is around the educational facility. You will be allotted



You will be allotted to a team which will hopefully comprise no more than six (Depends on entries). It will be up to the team as to how to approach the event. The scoring will be an accumulative approach. Which means that the team may go out in teams of 2, 3, 4 or 6. There may also may be some bonus opportunities to keep you thinking. You **cannot** go out by yourself and there must be an experienced person accompany someone less experienced. Everyone will be provided with a topographical map representative of the specific area you will be

in. On the map, natural features will be defined by navigational check points. Each navigational check point will have a point value.

There will be no massive ascents or descents on the course. All navigational check points will be within a contour range of 40-50 metres and will be on a tongue of land, thus providing a reasonably flat surface to walk on, apart from some areas which will be rocky and uneven. But there will some areas where short descents and ascents are inevitable, some of the ascents will lead to sweeping views of nearby gullies and valleys. The vegetation is distinctly vivid green in most parts with ankle length vegetation. There are some thicker parts located nearby streams and waterholes. Once you start you won't want to stop!

Start handing out maps 12:00

Please be there not later than 1pm

This will enable you be to be placed in a team, then organise a plan collectively.

Start no earlier than 14:00hrs

You may only want to go out for a few hours, relax at the Education Centre and venture out again. It's entirely up to you and your team mates. **However you must only spend 4 hrs maximum or less** on the challenge.

Finish no later than 18:30hrs
